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French B1 for Cultural and Environmental Heritage

The French Badge B1 for Cultural and Environmental Heritage certifies the achievement of level B1 for the French language, according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

In particular, the holder of the Badge acquires linguistic and lexical skills of the French language in the field of cultural and environmental heritage that allow him to communicate easily in an international study and/or work context. Knowing and communicating in a foreign language is a key skill required for employment in EU countries. This Badge certifies these skills which are indispensable skills that should be acquired by all the students of the Degree Programs related to the fields of cultural heritage and the environment (Department of European and Mediterranean Cultures, School of Agricultural and Forestry Sciences, School of Engineering).

The CEFR B1 level French language course, lasting 75 hours, is organized by the University Language Center (CLA) of the University of Basilicata. The CLA plays an important role in the internationalization process by organizing language courses with mother tongue teachers and exam sessions for students, teaching, research, technical and administrative staff aimed at participating in Erasmus programs and other exchange programs.



Skills

The owner of this Badge has proved to have the following **skills**:

- Learning a lexicon and a vocabulary that allows simple communication in various areas, including historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book fields.
- Intermediate written comprehension, relating to simple texts containing familiar or easy to interpret topics.
- Intermediate oral comprehension, relating to historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book topics, in which words and expressions already known or not difficult to understand.
- Autonomous written expression, with production of short written texts.
- Casual oral expression, with the use of simple sentences and historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book topics.

The owner of this badge has French language skills at level B1 - intermediate or "threshold" level (CEFR).

The owner of this Badge has shown to have acquired the following **soft skills**:

- Development of autonomous interaction skills, communicating on historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book topics and managing to interact within short conversations, exposing their opinions and projects.
- Ability to coordinate with other users.
- Ability to exercise a critical spirit in the evaluation of texts relating to the topics of interest.
- Ability to communicate effectively.
- Ability to express experiences and events, and also to briefly explain the reasons for his views and plans, with particular attention to the reference field.

The owner of this Badge has shown to have acquired the following **knowledge**:

- Homogeneous knowledge of the main grammatical structures of the French language
- Written and oral comprehension of key points of topics concerning historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book fields.
- Written and oral expression relating to topics concerning historical, artistic, archaeological, architectural, environmental, ethno-anthropological, archival, book fields.

At the end of the course the participants will have achieved an intermediate knowledge (Level B1) of the French language in the field of cultural and environmental heritage.

Criteria

The Badge is awarded following:

- admission to the French Course - B1 for Cultural and Environmental Heritage, after passing a specific placement test;
- attendance of at least 70% of the planned 75 hours;
- passing a final test.

The Badge recognizes the achievement of the B1 CEFR level for the French language.



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The University of Basilicata is the leading University of the Basilicata region, in the Southern part of Italy. Since 2012, according to the new University statute and rules of procedure, ex D.R. n. 88/2012, the University of Basilicata is organized through six primary structures (precisely four departments and two schools) in which the functions and the personnel of the pre-existing twelve departments and eight faculties have been re-addressed. Degree programs range from the Humanities, to architecture, archeology, education, economics and management, as well as to the STEM disciplines (hard sciences, agriculture, engineering, computer sciences). Such degree programs are effectively connected to the research, training and third mission activities developed by the primary structures. University of Basilicata counts about 7000 students, and is based in the cities of Potenza and Matera.



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
